



Quite a bit of growth and development obviously transpired in the intervening years! Mary and Joseph are the unsung heroes here, for having nurtured and raised Jesus in such a way that he was ready to fulfill his destiny. How can you continue to grow and develop in your faith?

Roll back the stone

Saint Pope John Paul II used the phrase the "culture of death" to describe society's willingness to undermine the value of human life at every turn. Abortion, euthanasia, capital punishment, war, torture, discrimination, exploitative practices in research, and economic injustice are just a few of the many ways we devalue the image of God inherent in each person. Rather than seeking peaceful, life-affirming solutions, living "among the tombs" allows us to embrace violent and inhumane options more readily. Take steps in your own life to roll back the tombstone of indifference and promote life among the living.

Keep in touch with Jesus

Jesus' power to heal transcended that of a mere traveling wonderworker or miracle man. His healing power came from God, and those who were afflicted were restored not just by his divine ability, but through their faith in him as the Son of God. His miracles reveal both his divinity and his humanity, as they often involved a personal, compassionate touch. Healing, like suffering, takes many forms—physical, emotional, and spiritual—and Jesus addresses each with care. In times of need, do not hesitate to turn to him in faith. He will hear you and, with wisdom, offer you the healing touch you seek.

Don't get stuck in a rut

In the gospel, we often see Jesus amazed by the faith of others, crediting their belief as the key to their healing. But there are also moments when Jesus is "amazed"—perhaps dismayed would be the better word—by the lack of faith in those around Him. Narrow thinking, rigid routines, stereotypes, and negative assumptions can all block the miracles of God's love. To experience the fullness of God's power, keep your faith alive and open a path for the Lord to perform mighty deeds.

Unchanging demands and promises

Paul Miki (1562-97) was born into a wealthy Catholic family and received his education from the Jesuits. He grew to be deeply immersed in his own culture, with a profound understanding of Buddhism. After joining the Society of Jesus, he became an effective and compassionate preacher to the Japanese people. Despite the expulsion of his fellow Jesuits from Japan, Paul Miki chose to remain and continued his mission. Ultimately, he was crucified alongside 25 others in Nagasaki. For each generation of Christians, the core demands of faith and the promises of Christ remain unchanged: to love God and one another, and through this love, to experience eternal life.

FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Forty days after Christmas, the epiphany continues. Jesus is manifest as the Light of all nations and the Savior of the world.

This feast day used to be called the Purification of Mary. It is also called Candlemas, because candles are blessed at Mass on this day. In the Roman Tradition, this feast is called the Presentation of the Lord. In the Byzantine tradition of the East, this feast is called the Encounter.

The many names for this feast day indicate the many truths that the Lord is revealing to us.

- Those who **encounter** Jesus in the Church know that He is the Resurrection and the Life and that He will free us from sin and death.
- Those who are cleansed and **purified** in the waters of Baptism, are immersed into the death of Christ so that they might live in Christ forever.
- In the Eucharist, we join ourselves to Christ and are offered and **presented** as a spiritual sacrifice to God.
- Finally, like candles that are consumed as they burn and give light, we are to die to self so that the **light** of God's love might be manifest through our lives.

As we celebrate this feast on Friday, and whenever we gather to celebrate the Eucharist and encounter the Lord in Word, Sacrament and one another, may we rejoice in the Light. May we radiate the light of God's love to all whom we encounter every day of our lives.

Meet Our Catechist

Mrs. Angela Lowe- I grew up in Murrysville and attended Mother of Sorrows School from 1st-8th grade. In 2016, when my daughters were in 1st and 2nd grade, we joined St. Mary Parish in an effort to find a Faith Formation program that would teach and guide them but also excite them while they learned.

I started helping with faith formation in 2019 and have had the opportunity to be part of the faith journey for these children, just as they have had a significant part in my own spiritual growth. This year I have been given the opportunity to teach the 4th grade children. The 4th graders have been focusing on learning about the importance and intention of rules, whether they are from God, a teacher, or mom and dad. The children have become more familiar with the Ten Commandments and are inquisitive while gaining an understanding of how these "rules" apply in everyday situations.

Active Participation in the Liturgy: The Role of the Offertory Gifts

As Catholics, we learn from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1071) that the faithful are called to conscious, active, and fruitful participation in the Liturgies. We engage in this participation through our responses, singing, and praying together. Another important role is presenting the Offertory Gifts to the priest. 
BAPTISMS


The soup will be given to our Food Pantry families in March. Please join us to provide a warm meal for our hungry neighbors.






