



Take a fresh look

It's easy to love our neighbors when they are friends or family. It gets a little dicier, however, when our neighbor is particularly unpleasant or has wronged us. How do we reach out in love without duplicity or patronization and also keep ourselves out of the line of fire? Jesus invites us to sidestep the temptation of repaying violence or unpleasantness with more of the same and instead to do the unexpected. He calls us to be creative and take a fresh look at the situation and respond with our best selves. Does this mean we become doormats for another's aggression or irrationality? No, but it does mean being willing to love, trusting that love can make a difference even if it is not returned in kind.

The heart of the matter

Our understanding of "unclean spirits" has remained fairly consistent over the centuries. We still view demonic forces possessing us in the form of mental anguish, negative thoughts, or destructive behavior. Similarly, we continue to make judgments about "clean" and "unclean" elements in our lives. Today, we spend billions on "cleansing" our bodies and minds of toxins and our cultures of what we deem malevolent influences. But often our motivations go beyond good health and safety and become embodiments of evil. Indeed, when it comes down to it, purity is really a matter of the heart. As Pope Francis says in his 2024 encyclical Dilexit nos (On the Human and Divine Love of the Heart of Jesus Christ), "All of us need to rediscover the importance of the heart."

Tuesday, Feb 25, 2025 Choose empathy

In scripture, children are often depicted as models of innocence, deserving of special care and protection. However, the sad reality is that such treatment remains a rarity for many of the world's children. Today, children face poverty, hunger, limited access to education, sexual abuse, forced labor, and the devastating impacts of war, conflict, and climate change. In 1989, the United Nations adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child, which has since become the most widely ratified human rights treaty in history. In a recent United Nations "State of the World's Children" annual report, a 16-year-old from Indonesia is quoted as saying, "Entering a new phase of our world is hard indeed. However, choose humanity and empathy to help create a better future for all of us." This is great advice for all of us to follow as we strive to protect and uplift the most vulnerable among us.

All are welcome

In an interview published by Catholic News Service on YouTube, Bishop Gerald Kicanas of the Diocese of Tucson addressed the question of whether Catholic organizations are still actually "Catholic" if they provide services to all people, Catholic or not. His response was clear and pastoral: "The heart of Catholic

outreach and social doctrine has been that we are here to serve all, and don't make distinctions. So, in our Catholic schools there are young people who are non-Catholic. In our Catholic charities, we serve people who are in need." Make the measure of your service and outreach love without distinction.

Thursday, Feb 27, 2025 Christian Econ 101

One of the most significant documents the American Roman Catholic bishops issued in the 20th century was Economic Justice for All. It calls fulfilling the needs of the poor the "highest priority" of economic policy and employment the "most urgent priority for domestic economic policy." Economic rights are fundamental human rights, as much as freedom of speech and religion. Some on Wall Street responded: What can a group of bishops know of high finance? A living Christianity, however, will always speak economic justice to economic power. Look for ways in your own life to use your economic strength to promote the common good.

Today's lesson leads to eternal life

Good teachers put their heart and soul into the effort, genuinely caring about the material they present. "To teach is to touch lives forever," said Saint John Bosco, "for the lessons imparted by a teacher echo through eternity." In the case of Jesus, the lessons lead to nothing less than our salvation, and he worked tirelessly to help human beings, both then and now, learn the curriculum. Surely, it must continue to frustrate him to have so many slow learners! Yet he keeps at it. As a disciple of Christ, try your best to be an attentive student and do your homework, which always involves an act of love.

Talk to angels

Children kneel guilelessly before holy images and participate in sacraments with great solemnity. They "bring flowers of the fairest" in May and linger by the manger in December. They ask probing questions about the man hurting on the cross before they have the language of faith to understand it. Mary of Nazareth showed such innocent piety, too, at least in the extra-biblical book The Gospel of the Birth of Mary, where the young Mary had conversations with angels every day. Maybe we did as well, once. Try to recapture a childlike sense and sensibility for all the wonders you encounter each day. Who are the angels in your life worthy of some daily attention?

SEVEN SISTERS APOSTOLATE

The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a call to strengthen the

Church by ensuring that a Holy Hour is prayed each day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest – a holy lavishing of prayer for the priest's deeper conformity to Christ.

This group has been active at Mother of Sorrows Parish for approximately six years without much fanfare, praying first for Monsignor Gaston, and now for Monsignor Michael.

Each member commits to a Holy Hour on a distinct day of the week, thus covering a complete week. The commitment is to that day; the Seven Sisters may pray at any time on that day. If she is unable to offer her Holy Hour, she is to secure a substitute, explaining the Apostolate's mission. The Holy Hour is ideally prayed in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament – either during Eucharistic exposition or in front of the Tabernacle.

This generous commitment of one hour per week of prayer is asked for a period of one year, but can remain open ended in time as each individual discerns her call to continue. We are looking to form two additional groups to pray for Father Dave and Father Jay.

If you are able to give one Holy Hour a week in prayer for one of our priests, please consider this invitation to serve the Church through your personal prayer.



HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY



All High School Youth are invited to meet on **Sunday, February 23** from **7:00 to 9:00 PM** in the lower narthex when we will have our second Evening of Encounter. This will be a time of reflection and prayer on the topic of chastity and Pope St. John Paul II's Theology of the Body, adoration and praise music, and confession. There will also be games and food in the Social Hall!

Last Sunday, High School Youth Ministry continued to pursue the goal of developing a better prayer life. The catechism says that prayer is a battle, and like any battle, it takes effort, persistence, and strategy to succeed. The teens shared their strategies for prayer, and we wrestled with questions like, "Do our prayers change God's mind?" and, "Why does it seem like our prayers go unanswered?" 
