Living Water



Today's readings: Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42 or 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42. When Jesus asks the Samaritan woman for water, she responds with confusion for a number of reasons. As Jesus continues to speak, her confusion deepens until she is enlightened. The exchange between the woman and Jesus is not only about finding the Messiah, but about being willing to accept the life of the resurrected One in our midst today.

Are you able to accept Christ in your midst at home, at work, in the marketplace, and at rest, as well as in church? How much confrontation is required before we recognize

the Living Water in our lives? Perhaps we will find the Living Water in those still, small moments when we are hoping to slip by the crowds. Perhaps we will find it in a moment of unexpected confrontation, when we truly hear the Word of God slip through the conversation. In this Gospel passage, Jesus reminds us that we are never isolated from the truth, nor are we alone in receiving the fruits of an individual's labor. In today's Gospel, what begins as two people meeting at a well becomes a profession of faith, by disciples and townspeople, that Jesus is truly the Savior of the world.

THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 4 Faith and Humility

When Jesus is asked to perform signs in his hometown as he did in other places, he refuses, saying, “No prophet is accepted in his own native place.” Jesus accepted that his former neighbors would not believe and so did not seek to prove himself. Sometimes we face humbling situations; we, too, do not need to prove ourselves. It is necessary only to accept that all we have is by the grace of God. *Today’s readings: 2 Kings 5:1–15ab; Psalm 42:2–3; 43: 3–4; Luke 4:24–30.*

Tuesday, March 5 Love and Kindness

In today’s Gospel, Jesus tells Peter that he must forgive another “not seven times but seventy-seven times.” From that instruction, we may ascertain that we are to forgive over and over again. Such forgiveness is an act of kindness, one which any of us would hope to receive after our own transgression. When wronged, we have an opportunity to create enmity or to nurture love. Who needs your forgiveness? From whom do you need to request forgiveness? *Today’s readings: Daniel 3:25, 34–43; Psalm 25:4–5ab, 6, 7bc, 8–9; Matthew 18:21–35.*

Wednesday, March 6 Praise the Lord

“Praise the Lord, Jerusalem,” we sing today in the refrain for Psalm 147. In recognizing all that God has done, the psalm is a reminder that prayers of praise should be part of our prayer life. During these remaining weeks of Lent, schedule a time at the end of the day to recall the ways that God has blessed you. Compose your own prayer of praise and thanksgiving. You might include today’s refrain in your prayer. *Today’s readings: Deuteronomy 4:1, 5–9; Psalm 147:12–13, 15–16, 19–20; Matthew 5:17–19.*

Thursday, March 7 Soften Your Hearts

In the reading from Jeremiah, the Lord speaks of how his people have ignored his voice and his commands. The Lord tells the prophets: “But they obeyed not, nor did they pay heed. They walked in the hardness of their hearts.” Hardened hearts are still noticed, as people are concerned with many things. Efforts can be made to soften hearts. Today, tell someone that God loves him or her, and that you do too. Do not expect a response. *Today’s readings: Jeremiah 7:23–28; Psalm 95:1–2, 6–7, 8–9; Luke 11:14–23.*

Friday, March 8 Listen with Your Heart

Sometimes we ask questions when we already know the answer. Are we hoping for a different answer from what we know is from God? The third week of Lent is winding down. Have you committed to a process of transformation? Have you set aside time for discernment and reflection? As the Lenten season continues, take courage and listen with your heart. *Today’s readings: Hosea 14:2–10; Psalm 81:6c–8a, 8bc–9, 10–11ab, 14, 17; Mark 12:28–34.*

Saturday, March 9 Spring Cleaning

The phrase “Practice makes perfect” is kept in mind while seeking to improve performance. In today’s readings, we hear that God desires our love and mercy, not our sacrifice. Each season of the liturgical year is a new opportunity to grow in our love for God and others and to learn to be generous with our mercy. Lent’s emphasis on penitence and baptism is an invitation to discard what keeps us from God and bring to the fore those practices that conform us to the promises of our baptism. Some might call this an interior spring cleaning. *Today’s readings: Hosea 6:1–6; Psalm 51:3–4, 18–19, 20–21ab; Luke 18:9–14.*

LENTEN TAIZÉ PRAYER

Taizé is a distinctive style of meditation prayer developed by an ecumenical community of monks in rural France. This quiet, moving reflective prayer combines elements of the Church's traditional Liturgy of the Hours with elements of contemplative meditation.

A typical Taizé prayer service incorporates periods of silence with meditative readings from Scripture, prayers of praise and intercession, and the frequent repetition of simple, contemporary chants based on the Psalms or other parts of Scripture. The result is to gradually move prayer from the head to the heart.

STRENGTH FOR THE JOURNEY

On the first Sunday of Lent, we always hear the story of Jesus going into the desert where he is tempted by Satan. On the second Sunday of Lent, we hear the story of the Transfiguration. These two stories form the bedrock of our life during Lent.

The first account reminds us that Jesus knew the lure of sin, yet strengthened by his prayer and fasting, he was able to resist false and empty promises for the truth of his mission.

Jesus also sensed the rejection and suffering he and his disciples would face in Jerusalem. In the account of the Transfiguration we hear how Jesus gives Peter, James and John a glimpse of his risen glory. Jesus allows them to know the source of his identity and power. When they become frightened or begin to doubt, Jesus wants them to remember this experience to help them stay on course.

We also have similar moments of clarity and conviction. For some it's an experience of prayer or a retreat, for others the awesome beauty of nature. For still others, it happens with a particular person or life event, like the birth of a child, or sickness, or even the death of a loved one.

But mountaintop experiences do not last. Like Peter, James, and John, we must come down from the mountain to the demands and obligations of our daily lives. Yet we are changed and we resume our daily tasks with a renewed sense of the mystery and the love of God.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

God created us to experience joy in communion with each other, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all of creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbor, and creation; and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. As God's beloved children, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor.

As Lent comes to a close, we can use the prayer we pray every day, the ***Our Father***, as the basis for the examination of our lives, as the benchmark for how faithfully we are living in our relationship to God and others.

Our Father who art in Heaven. Do we live as grateful children of God, our loving Father. Do we put God before all else, or do other things get in the way: our possessions, our schedules, our pleasures? Do we live out our baptismal promises by professing our faith in our daily words and actions?

Hallowed be Thy Name. Do we honor God's name in faithful prayer? Do we show our respect for others by the language we use? Do we respect all life and all of God's creation, as holy?

Thy Kingdom come. Do our actions contribute to the building up of God's Kingdom? Do we share generously of our time, talent, and treasure to do God's work? Are we faithful stewards of the many gifts that God has to given us? Do we live with honesty and integrity?

Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. De we seek God's will or our own in our daily lives? Are we selfless in our service, or selfish with what God has given us?

Give us this day our daily bread. Do we trust that God will give us what we need? Or do we insist upon having what we want, when we want? Do we live our lives in a spirit of gratitude? Do we whine and complain when we don't get what we want? Are we envious or jealous of others?

And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Do we forgive others as God has forgiven us? Are we willing to let go of past hurts and resentment?

And lead us not into temptation. Trials can help us grow and temptation can make us strong if we face them with an acknowledgement of our weakness and our need for God's help. Do we pray for God's help? Do we learn from our errors?

But deliver us from evil. Do we avoid what we know is harmful to ourselves or others? Do we really try to avoid the occasions of sin? Do we bring to God our cares and troubles? Do we place our lives in God's hands?

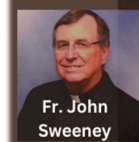
