

Sunday, March 10, 2024 Man Born Blind

Today's readings: Samuel 16:1b, 6–7, 10–13a; Psalm 23:1–3a, 3b–4, 5, 6; Ephesians 5:8–14; John 9:1–41. Today we celebrate the second scrutiny with the elect and hear the story of the man born blind. In the verse preceding today's Gospel, Jesus says that he is the light of the world. This is a primary image as we ponder the Gospel.

During the time of Jesus, sickness was thought to be a punishment for sins. In the Gospels, disease is often used to highlight those who are marginalized from the community. Jesus' ministry is one of healing and bringing people back to the community, back to the flock. When Jesus heals the blind man, he not only cures his blindness, but also reveals

to him God's saving power. Jesus brought light into this man's life, and because he has been made clean, he can rejoin the community. Just like last Sunday's Gospel, today's reading is one of faith. Once the man is healed, he comes to know Jesus, the Messiah, and boldly claims that he believes.

As we pray with the elect during these final days of Lent, think about all the blind spots that keep you from seeing God's saving power. Ask that Jesus will heal those areas of your life that hold you in sin. Once we have named our sin and sought forgiveness, the Holy Spirit fills us to go forth to boldly proclaim, "I do believe, Lord." How can you reach out to the "blind" in your community?

THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 11 Blind Faith

John tells the story of a man pleading for Jesus to cure his dying child. The miracle of the cure convinced this man and the others present that Jesus was the Messiah. But what about those of us who have never witnessed such a miracle? Take some time to journal about your faith in Jesus. On what do you base your belief? How much do you trust in the Lord? Today's readings: Isaiah 65:17–21 Psalm 30:2, 4, 5–6, 11–12a, 13b; John 4:43–54.

Tuesday, March 12 Journeying Together

Asking for or accepting help shows courage because it implies that we are not self-sufficient. Recognizing our dependence on God and one another is a virtue. Being in relationship with others requires listening. Today, await the answer when asking someone how he or she is doing. Then really listen. Similarly, make sure that you leave space and time in your prayer for God's voice to bubble up inside of you. Today's readings: Ezekiel 47:1–9, 12: Psalm 46:2–3, 5–6, 8–9; John 5:1–16.

Wednesday, March 13 Blind Faith

While the Lord is a just judge, people are not always so fair or righteous. Are you your worst critic? The idea of self-compassion might seem hedonistic or selfish, yet it can be hard to give what we do not possess. If we desire to extend God's kindness to others, we need to express compassion toward ourselves. Examine how well you practice patience and mercy toward others. To improve, begin with yourself. Today's readings: Isaiah 49:8–15; Psalm 145:8–9, 13cd–14, 17–18; John 5:17–30.

Thursday, March 14 Taking a Pause

During every Mass, we encounter Christ in the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. He is present especially in the consecrated bread and wine, in the Scriptures, in the ministers, and in the assembly. God does not want us to continue wandering in the desert; he beckons us to the promised land of eternal life. This week, meditate on a part of the Mass. Practice being truly present during Mass to allow space for conversion and transformation. Today's readings: Exodus 32:7–14; Psalm 106:19–20, 21–22, 23; John 5:31–47.

Friday, March 15 Genuine Encounter

What does it mean to truly know someone? Have you followed a famous figure or professional contact and felt that you knew everything about him or her without having even met the person? Or perhaps you met the individual and encountered someone different than you had imagined. In today's Gospel, the inhabitants of Jerusalem think that they know Jesus, but their knowledge is on a surface level. They do not know the One who sent him. When you read the Scriptures, invite the words to fill your heart so that you can know the Lord. Today's readings: Wisdom 2:1a, 12–22; Psalm 34:17–18, 19–20, 21, 23: John 7:1–2, 10, 25–30.

Saturday, March 16 The Body of Christ

Many things can distract us as we seek to become closer to God and spread the Good News. How can you stay rooted in a life of discipleship? What are some of the things you can do in your community to continue the ministry of Jesus? Can you read to children at the library? Or volunteer in a soup kitchen? Does your community have a cleanup day for which you could sign up? Strive to be walking testimonies of Jesus' love. Today's readings: Jeremiah 11:18–20; Psalm 7:2–3, 9bc–10, 11–12; John 7:40–53.

THE EASTER TRIDUUM

The Triduum is the Church's endless reflection on a way of life that leads through the cross to the Resurrection. You are invited to come to the liturgies on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

Holy Thursday - March 28

Celebrate the joy of ministry that is the fabric of service to others. In the washing of the feet we come to a profound humility rooted in the example of Christ. On this same Holy Thursday night, we celebrate the arrival of the Holy Oils blessed by the Bishop: the Oil of Chrism, the Oil of the Sick, and the Oil of Catechumens.

Good Friday - March 29

Celebrate the ultimate mystery of the triumph of the cross. Unite your sufferings and those of the world with the Lord of the Cross. Venerate the cross, our sign of victory beyond pain and death. Good Friday is the birth of hope and peace.

The Easter Vigil - March 30

Gather around the Easter bonfire as we proclaim Christ is our Light! Recall the history of salvation in Word and song. Relive new life given in the waters of Baptism. Welcome new Christians and join us in the proclamation of the Resurrection and the refreshment of the Eucharist. Plan to be here for this liturgy, the highpoint of the liturgical year!

STRENGTH FOR THE JOURNEY

The scribes and Pharisees complained about Jesus because he ate with sinners. Jesus defends his actions by telling the parable of the prodigal son, or, as it is also called, the parable of the forgiving father. The father, who daily waits in hope for his son's return, welcomes him back with open arms, and even more, calls for a celebration. To the older brother's complaint, the father emphasizes that he has always been in relationship to him and now the one who was lost is found.

Today's second reading reinforces the parable: "All this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation."

Because we have been loved first, we can love; because we have been forgiven, we can forgive.

It is not a surprise that Jesus would use the example of a father and his sons. The family is where most of us first learn about love and reconciliation. Yet it is also the place where many of us also experience tension and estrangement.

Squabbles may be over little matters and relatively short-lived, or arguments and disagreements may tear the fabric of family life into shreds.

Whatever we experience in our families, the season of Lent is an opportune time to consider seriously what needs to be healed and restored. Daily prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation are tools to help us toward that change of heart.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

God created us to experience joy in communion with each other, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all of creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbor, and creation; and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. As God's beloved children, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor.

As Lent comes to a close, we can use the prayer we pray every day, the *Our Father*, as the basis for the examination of our lives, as the benchmark for how faithfully we are living in our relationship to God and others.

- Our Father who art in Heaven. Do we live as grateful children of God, our loving Father. Do we put God before all else, or do other things get in the way: our possessions, our schedules, our pleasures? Do we live out our baptismal promises by professing our faith in our daily words and actions?
- Hallowed be Thy Name. Do we honor God's name in faithful prayer? Do we show our respect for others by the language we use? Do we respect all life and all of God's creation, as holy?
- Thy Kingdom come. Do our actions contribute to the building up of God's Kingdom? Do we share generously of our time, talent, and treasure to do God's work? Are we faithful stewards of the many gifts that God has to given us? Do we live with honesty and integrity?
- Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. De we seek God's will or our own in our daily lives? Are we selfless in our service, or selfish with what God has given us?
- Give us this day our daily bread. Do we trust that God will give us what we need? Or do we insist upon having what we want, when we want? Do we live our lives in a spirit of gratitude? Do we whine and complain when we don't get what we want? Are we envious or jealous of others?
- And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Do we forgive others as God has forgiven us? Are we willing to let go of past hurts and resentment?
- And lead us not into temptation. Trials can help us grow and temptation can make us strong if we face them with an acknowledgement of our weakness and our need for God's help. Do we pray for God's help? Do we learn from our errors?
- But deliver us from evil. Do we avoid what we know is harmful to ourselves or others? Do we really try to avoid the occasions of sin? Do we bring to God our cares and troubles? Do we place our lives in God's hands?

OUTREACH UPDATE- JANUARY/FEBRUARY

- Our Food Pantry provided food for 316 individuals in January and 371 individuals in February, including meat, cheese, eggs, milk, and produce. We thank First Presbyterian Church of Murrysville for their donation of laundry detergent to the families. We thank all volunteers and parishioners who help to feed the hungry each month.
- Outreach provided \$500 to the Catholic Men's Fellowship for the purchase of coats for the homeless men who come to the Red Door Ministry, St. Mary of Mercy.
- We will sponsor two community dinners at the Knead Café in New Kensington. Anyone is welcome to come and eat at no charge.
- We have sent financial support to a young parishioner at Immaculate Conception Parish who has developed an Outreach program for individuals who have cancer or who reside in nursing homes.
- Financial support was sent to Sr Donatella, a Sister of Charity of Ivrea, who has been living in a village in Lebanon and along with her small community, has been maintaining a Christian presence in the village. Given the current situation in Lebanon, the Sisters are in great need of basic supplies and food.
- Through the Walking with Moms program, Outreach is providing maternity clothing for a pregnant woman in need.
- We continue to help struggling families and individuals with utility and rent assistance.

LENTEN "BREAKFAST BAGS"



During Lent, our Outreach Ministry is sponsoring a "Breakfast Bag" program for our Food Pantry families. Parishioners can pick up a market bag and a suggested list of food before or after Masses this

Thank you for helping to feed the hungry.

Bill has been an influential voice in Pittsburgh sports for decades as the play-by-play voice of the Pitt Panthers football and basketball teams for over 50 years. In 1994 he was handpicked by Steelers owner Dan Rooney as the team's play-by-play announcer.

Bill was inducted into the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters' Hall of Fame last year.






