Sunday, March 24, 2024 Never Alone

Today's readings: Gospel at the procession Mark 11:1–10 or John 12:12–16; Isaiah 50:4–7; Psalm 22:8–9, 17–18, 19–20, 23–24; Philippians 2:6–11; Mark 14:1–15:47. Today's readings leave us much to ponder. During the Gospel at the procession, a crowd welcomes Jesus to Jerusalem, singing, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" At the end of the Gospel from Mark, Jesus was not hailed but reviled as passersby taunted, "You who would destroy the temple in three days, save yourself by coming down from the cross."

In the last verses from Mark's Gospel, we witness the faith of the steadfast disciples, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of younger James and Joses, and Salome. These women had followed Jesus in Galilee, stood by until his death, and watched where he was laid in a tomb. Apparent, too, is the faith of Joseph of Arimathea, who wrapped Jesus in linen and laid him in the tomb.

Also obvious in the Gospel is the wavering faith of those who had followed Jesus for three years. Not only did Judas betray Jesus, but Peter could not stay awake with him as he prayed in the garden, and later Peter denied him three times. The Gospel proclaimed today does not record the apostles' presence at the crucifixion.

During Holy Week, Christians have the opportunity to be with Christ as his last days are recalled. Take to heart Jesus' words to the apostles in Gethsemane: "Remain here and keep watch."

THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 25

A Precious Offering

In today's Gospel we see how Mary, Lazarus' sister, takes what may have been her most precious possession and used it to anoint Jesus' feet. We are also given opportunities to give the very best of ourselves. Today, examine whether you have gifts within you that you hold back. Who would benefit from those gifts? Today's readings: Isaiah 42:1–7; Psalm 27:1, 2, 3, 13–14; John 12:1–11.

Tuesday, March 26 Judas Is Humanity

Imagine how Jesus would have felt knowing that Judas was about to betray him. He surely was troubled but also hurt. Let us also imagine what may have been in the mind and heart of Judas. In Judas we can see all of humanity reflected: the emptiness of greed and envy, the alienation and loneliness of sin. However much we strive to be like Jesus, we will always meet our flaws and shortcomings. In Christ, however, we are strengthened to do good in the world despite our failings. As we approach the celebration of the resurrection and prepare for the renewal of our baptismal promises, resolve to let the new life that Christ gives to well up within you. Today's readings: Isaiah 49:1–6; Psalm 7:1–2, 3–4a, 5ab–6ab, 15, 17; John 13:21–33, 36–38.

Wednesday, March 27

Second Chances

Much can be learned from Judas' betrayal. Perhaps by examining Judas' actions, we can right our failings. Consider how you can explore and acknowledge what keeps you from God. This week reflect on the times you preferred a path other than God's. How did following another way disturb your relationship with God and others? Trust in God's promise of forgiveness for all who truly repent. *Today's readings:* Isaiah 50:4–9a; Psalm 69:8–10; 21–22, 31, 33–34; Matthew 26:14–25.

Thursday, March 28 Serving Others

Tonight, with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Sacred Paschal Triduum begins. Humbling himself, Jesus washed and dried the feet of the disciples. Just as he washed their feet, by his resurrection, he washed away our sins. Perhaps you have an elderly parent, neighbor, or relative with impaired movement. How can you humble yourself and be of service to another? Mass of the Lord's Supper: Exodus 12:1–8, 11–14; Psalm 116:12–13, 15–16bc, 17–18; 1 Corinthians 11:23–26; John 13:1–15.

Friday, March 29 Symbol of Love

During the Adoration of the Holy Cross in today's liturgy, the faithful are invited to process to the cross and offer a sign of reverence. Even when you are unable to attend this service, spend time in quiet contemplating Jesus' surrender of himself on the cross. How are you asked to surrender yourself to the crosses in your life? Celebration of the Passion of the Lord: Isaiah 52:13—53:12; Psalm 31:2, 6, 12–13, 15–16, 17, 25; Hebrews 4:14–16, 5:7–9; John 18:1—19:42.

Saturday, March 30 Beacon of Light in the Darkness

Jesus has died and descended into hell but the darkness surrounding us is only temporary. The light of the world will shine brightly once more, and soon enough it will defeat the darkness. Today's readings: Genesis 1:1—2:2; Psalm 104:1–2, 5–6, 10, 12, 13–14, 24, 35 or Psalm 33:4–5, 6–7, 12–13, 20–22; Genesis 22:1–18; Psalm 16:5, 8, 9–10, 11; Exodus 14:15—15:1; Exodus 15:1–2, 3–4, 5–6, 17–18; Isaiah 54:5–14; Psalm 30:2, 4, 5–6, 11–12, 13; Isaiah 55:1–11; Isaiah 12:2–3, 4, 5–6; Baruch 3:9–15, 32—4:4; Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 11; Ezra 36:16–17a, 18–28; Psalm 42:3, 5; 43:3, 4 or Isaiah 12:2–3, 4bcd, 5–6 or Psalm 51:12–13, 14–15, 18–19; Romans 6:3–11; Psalm 118:1–2, 16–17, 22–23; Mark 16:1–7.

TRIDUUM: THE THREE DAYS

Our 40-day season of Lent ends on the evening of Holy Thursday as the Church begins its annual celebration of the Sacred Paschal Triduum or the Three Days. Beginning with the Lord's Supper on Thursday night and continuing to Easter Sunday evening, these three days form the most important days of the Church year.

Why are these days so significant? Because our faith in Jesus dead and risen all comes together in these three days. We penetrate in great depth the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection. We take three days to celebrate this great foundation of our faith because it is simply too powerful and rich for a one-day celebration. Even though we take three days, it is still one mystery we celebrate.

The purpose of the Triduum is not to participate in a historical re-enactment of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. For we know that the Lord is risen and will never die again. It is the risen Christ who calls us together to remember all he did to save us so that by remembering the Passover of the Lord we might encounter again the saving grace of these sacred events.

Thursday of the Lord's Supper (Holy Thursday)



As we begin our Triduum celebration on Thursday night at 7:00, the first reading sets the tone for the next three days. We hear from the book of Exodus about the Jewish Passover which Israel is instructed to keep as a living memorial of their liberation and covenant with God. In the Triduum, our Christian Passover, Jesus is the new Moses who will lead us out of the darkness and bondage of sin to the promised land of the kingdom.

In the Gospel we find Jesus falling to his knees to wash the feet of his disciples. Washing the disciples' feet was more than a kind deed. In humility Jesus demonstrated his self-donation, the outpouring of his life for the liberation and redemption of the world. The washing of feet is a preview of what Jesus will do at Calvary.

There has always been a special focus on the Eucharist on Holy Thursday. But our understanding of the Eucharist must be seen within the total framework of this Passover. The Eucharist is given to us at a great price, the very life of Jesus. When Jesus says, "Do this in memory of me," he asks us to not only celebrate this ritual again and again, but to pour out our lives in sacrifice for others as he did. We are to be Eucharist for each other. We must act out what we celebrate. We ritualize this when members of our own community wash each others' feet.

At the conclusion of this evening everyone is invited to remain in silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament with those who will be initiated at the Easter Vigil. During these days we need to set aside time for prayer and reflection.

Friday of the Passion of the Lord (Good Friday)

On Good Friday we turn to the cross and the passion of Christ. We look on the cross not as a sign of defeat and hopelessness, but as a sign of victory over sin and death. The cross of Jesus is our sign of hope, the constant reminder of the price of love Jesus willingly accepted.

At 12:00 NN we celebrate the Stations of the Cross which depict the final hours of Jesus. This popular Catholic devotion helps the faithful to make a spiritual pilgrimage of prayer; to contemplate, and enter into, the mystery of Jesus' gift of himself to us. "We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross, you have redeemed the world."



The Good Friday liturgy, which begins at 1:30 PM, is divided into three parts: the Liturgy of the Word, the Adoration of the Holy Cross, and Holy Communion. The Liturgy of the Word revolves around the proclamation of the Passion from John's Gospel. John's Passion contains a powerful paradox that while Jesus is mocked and spat upon he is still King and Victor.

During the second part of this liturgy, we adore the cross which is a sober reminder of the price of our redemption. This same cross is also a sign of life and hope for us. No Christian can look upon the cross this day without hearing the invitation to take up his or her cross and follow Jesus. We are invited to venerate the cross by touching it, kissing it, genuflecting before it, etc., as a personal sign of reverence, faith and gratitude.

Next we share in the Eucharist that was consecrated at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on the previous evening. Again all are invited to stay in silent prayer before the cross with those who will be initiated at the Easter Vigil.

The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night



On Holy Saturday the Church waits at the Lord's tomb, reflecting on his suffering and death. It is a day of quiet prayer and reflection. The Blessing of the Baskets takes place at 12:00 NN.

The Easter Vigil begins at 8:00 PM. This is the holiest of all nights in our Church year. This liturgy beautifully expresses our passage from death to life, darkness to light, suffering to glory. It is on this night that we discover our identity as God's people, led by the light of Christ, baptized into his death and resurrection, and sharing with one another in Eucharist his presence and future glory. On this night we celebrate the totality of our faith.

The Vigil is composed of four parts: the Solemn Beginning of the Vigil or Lucernarium, the Liturgy of the Word, the Baptismal Liturgy, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist

SOLEMN BEGINNING OF THE VIGIL OR LUCERNARIUM: We begin the Vigil in the dark outside (weather permitting) to remind us of the horrible darkness of life without Christ. At this point a new fire is ignited and blessed. In this fire we see Christ who this night casts out the darkness of sin and death. From this fire we light the new Paschal candle which becomes a symbol of the risen Christ present among

LITURGY OF THE WORD: This evening we have an extended Liturgy of the Word that covers all of salvation history starting with creation and ending with the resurrection. We hear all that has led up to this night, how God from age to age has willed the salvation of all humankind, a promise fulfilled in the person of Jesus. It recounts the story of who we are as Christians.

BAPTISMAL LITURGY: All of Lent has led to this night when the Church calls the elect and the candidates to the Easter sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Eucharist.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST: This final part of the vigil is the celebration of the first Eucharist of Easter. We give thanks for Christ our Paschal Lamb, and like the disciples at Emmaus we come to discover Christ present with us at the breaking of the bread.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION



In this final Sunday of Lent, as we prepare to enter the sacred time of the Paschal Triduum, we look again at the significance of Christ in our lives. We recognize him as our Savior, but we look more closely in order

to discover just what kind of Savior he is.

Though he was in the form of God, Jesus came to us as a servant. We have a Savior who was crushed for our iniquities, nailed to a cross as a convicted felon, and there endured a sense of abandonment. We have a Savior who lived his life out of love for us.

We have a Savior who was lifted up and exalted, precisely because he emptied himself of his status as God. Unlike victors who triumph by putting down their opponents, Jesus was raised up because he was willing to be put down, to suffer, and to die for us.

We have a Savior who first offered himself for us and now continues to offer himself to us as an example to follow. As he was willing to empty himself for our sake, so we are told to empty ourselves for the sake of others. As we enter into this Holy Week, we are invited to do so in the company of those with whom Jesus identified: the poor and the broken; the humiliated and marginalized; those who suffer the abuse of others; those who never use rank to force their will. If we are to celebrate our salvation in Christ, we must go wherever Christ empties himself for our salvation.
