



#### Faithful Citizenship \'fath-fəl 'si-tə-zən-'ship\

Popular shorthand for the teaching document *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, published by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, and drawing from Catholic scripture, tradition, and social teaching. It offers guidance to U.S. Catholics on the political responsibility to participate in their democracy.

#### CONTEXT

In the Catholic tradition, responsible **citizenship** is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation. *—USCCB*, Faithful Citizenship

By forming our consciences for **faithful citizenship**, we can better pursue the common good and thus obey the command of our Lord to love our neighbors. *—USCCB*, Faithful Citizenship

#### WHY IT MATTERS

As Pope Francis explains, "Everything, including political life, belongs to Jesus Christ, and so participation in political life belongs to the mission of the Church." Of course, "The Church cannot and must not replace the State," says Pope Benedict. "Yet at the same time she cannot and must not remain on the sidelines in the fight for justice."

From Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: How can we meet this challenge of forming our consciences? Saint Paul gives us a way: Put on the "mind of Christ" (1 Cor. 2:16). [Step away from media] and "spend time with Holy Scripture and the Blessed Sacrament... Listen in silence. Volunteer at a soup kitchen, a homeless shelter, a crisis pregnancy center. Serve the poor, the needy, the outcast. Pray often."

#### What is Catholic decision-making?

Church teaching emphasizes that the common good is an essential component in our decision-making. "The common good is the sum total of social conditions which allow people. either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily" (CCC, 1906). If this sounds like a huge responsibility, you're hearing it right. We advance the common good with five principles: defending human life, strengthening families, providing for the disadvantaged, welcoming the immigrant, and protecting the environment. The gravest imperative is to protect life. Direct assaults on life include abortion, capital punishment, euthanasia, genocide, torture, racism, unjust war, and exploitation of creation. The common good also includes ensuring access to healthcare and education, guaranteeing living wages, addressing hunger, encouraging debt relief, ending discrimination, promoting religious freedom, and pursuing peace.

#### SUNDAY MASS SCHEDULE

Every year the diocese requests parishes to submit attendance numbers for weekend Masses during the month of October. Why October? Because by then, summer vacations are over, kids are back in school and Mass attendance pretty much reflects the average weekly attendance as seen throughout the year (excluding holy days, summer vacation and special celebrations).

A review of the numbers for the past several years seems to indicate that we do not need the number of Masses that we currently have, according to the diocesan *Guidelines for Evaluating the Quality and Number of Sunday Masses*.

This document notes that "in the early days of the Church, the community came together under one roof to celebrate the Eucharist on the Lord's Day. In this way, by sharing together the one Bread and the one Cup, the community was joined together as the one Body of Christ. Only when the ideal of one Eucharistic assembly became impractical or impossible as the community grew in size did it become necessary for the community to divide into smaller assemblies, and thus to multiply Masses on the Lord's Day."

"Over the centuries the multiplication of Mases became a growing problem and even an abuse in some places. When permission was granted to allow the Saturday evening Mass, many parishes simply added extra Masses for convenience, rather than for the real need of the community or for the sense of unity that is celebrated in the Eucharist. In general, Masses were added to the weekend schedule to provide more opportunities for people to participate in Sunday Eucharist. In some cases, the proliferation of Masses, accompanied by shifts in population and the declining number of clergy, has become detrimental to the unity envisioned in the celebration of the Sunday Eucharist."

With this in mind, I have begun a consultation with staff and members of the Pastoral and Finance councils of our three parishes to examine the weekend Mass schedule. After this, I will consult with Bishop Kulick and hope to announce a decision at the beginning in December regarding the Mass schedule for the new year.

# **4 VOCATION VOCABULARY**

#### BROTHER

Men who belong to a religious community and promise to serve the Church in a special way for life (unlike a priest, they do not administer sacraments).

DEACON

An ordained minister who may preach the Gospel, teach, baptize, lead prayers, witness marriages and conduct wake and funeral services. A married man can become a deacon if he is over the age of 35.

#### MONK

A member of a men's religious community who lives a life of prayer in a monastery.

#### ORDINATION

Ceremony for men who have fulfilled all the requirements to become a priest; they receive the and administer the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

#### DIOCESAN PRIEST

Priest ordained to serve in one particular diocese, or area of the Church overseen by a bishop or archbishop.

#### PRIEST

Men who offer leadership and service to the Church sacraments to God's people.

#### SEMINARY

School specializing in classes for students who are studying to become a priest (seminarians).



MOTHER HOUSE The main home/headquarters for sisters.

#### NUN

Women in religious orders (sisters) living a cloistered (secluded) life of prayer in a monastery.

#### NOVITIATE

Time of intense spiritual formation in which candidates (often called novices) learn about the community they want to join.

Woman who takes vows to serve God in a special way, such as teachers, doctors, partsh workers.

MONASTERY Home of monks or nuns devoted to prayer.

SISTER

#### **RELIGIOUS ORDER/ CONGREGATION** National or international group of priests, sisters or brothers who take vows to serve the Lord in a special way, such as teaching or missionary work.

#### PERPETUAL VOWS Promise made to commit oneself as a priest, sister or brother for the rest of one's life.

### TEMPORARY VOWS

Promise a man or woman makes to spend a period of trial and testing with a religious order.





#### SACRAMENTAL MARRIAGE

A covenant between a baptized man and woman that establishes a partnership of the whole life, which is ordered toward the good of the spouses and procreation and education of offspring.
