### Lent – a 40-day journey back to our Baptism

Every Lent we come back to our baptism. We struggle with the hard questions we were asked: Do you reject Satan? And all his works? And all his empty promises? We stand alongside our sisters and brothers preparing for baptism. With them we look into the frightening water. As St. Paul reminds us, these are the waters by which we die to self, so that we might rise with Christ.

At Baptism, Christians take on three life-long disciplines: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They help us to remain faithful to our baptism. Each of these disciplines can take many forms. Prayer is communication with God. Fasting is self-denial, self-control, simple living. Almsgiving is giving to those in need. We give of our money, our talents, our time.

These three disciplines function best when they are done together. They balance each other. The word itself, *discipline*, reminds us that we are disciples of Christ. Our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are three concrete ways that we live as faithful disciples.

### Ash Wednesday – February 14

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of our spiritual journey as we accompany Jesus on His way to the cross. As we are signed with ashes, we acknowledge that we are sinners and we promise that, during this Lenten season, we will strive to be better Christians. Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. Traditionally, this means only one full meal and no meat. But fasting also means less entertainment, less noise, less nonsense.

### Family and Parish-wide Faith Formation


Special Family and Parish Faith Formation sessions are planned on **Sunday, March 10 from 4:30 PM - 5:30 PM and Wednesday, March 13 from 6:30 PM-7:30 PM** to give families and all members of our parish the opportunity to discover together the importance of the Easter Triduum. We will explore a number of the important ritual actions of the Triduum, including:

Holy Thursday - Washing of Feet and Procession with the Blessed Sacrament Good Friday - Veneration of the Cross Easter Vigil - Procession of Light and Blessing of Baptismal Water

All families are invited and encouraged to attend, especially those preparing for the celebration of the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, those with children in Faith Formation, and those with children in Mother of Sorrows School.

### Easter Triduum - March 28-31

The Easter Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. What Sunday is to the week, the solemnity of Easter is to the Church year. The Easter Triduum begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, and reaches its high point at the Easter Vigil. As a parish family, we gather on these three days to celebrate our faith in Jesus Christ and our communion with each other in the Church.
