My Dear Parishioners,

While I was on retreat in Arizona in early August, I reflected upon my first year as Pastor of Mother of Sorrows Parish. I am grateful for your warm welcome when I first arrived and the encouragement and support I continue to receive from many of you before and after Mass each weekend. Be assured of my gratitude and prayers for each of you!

Much has happened in these past 15 months with regards to our facilities, finances, staff and parish life. Some of these are highlighted below:

FACILITIES We replaced the roof on the church and repaved the lower parking lot. We landscaped the front of the school and the grounds surrounding the church. Repairs were made to some of the concrete sidewalks around the church and school. We recently began the renovation of the Food Pantry Room.

FINANCES We received several generous donations which enabled us to fund a new staff position (Pastoral Associate for Spiritual Care), to completely pay for the landscaping project around the church and school, and to fund the renovation of the Food Pantry Room. Your response to the Sermon on the Amount last October helped to generate a 12% increase in the Sunday offertory over the previous year!

STAFF With a relaxation of COVID protocols, all staff members returned to work in person. In light of recent departures and resignations, we are currently restructuring job descriptions for staff positions. We recently hired a Pastoral Associate for Discipleship and Parish Life and a Communication Coordinator/Office Manager.

PARISH LIFE We have almost returned to pre-pandemic numbers (1,300 attendees) at Sunday Mass. Many of the programs that were put on hold or done remotely during the pandemic have resumed in person, and several new ones are emerging: Hearts Ablaze! Young Women's Group, Guys and God, Bereavement Ministry, and opportunities for Spiritual Direction.

I invite you to review the information presented in the next few pages about our parish, and then to make a prayerful commitment to helping us realize our hopes and dreams for the parish.

May God bless you and your loved ones, and may Mary, Mother of Sorrows, continue to be a model of standing by one another as we live as faith-filled disciples of her Son.

OUR FINANCIAL PICTURE

Our parish continues to be in sound financial shape. At the end of the last fiscal year, we were able to meet all of our obligations, and pay our bills and loans in a timely fashion. This is due to the generosity of many of our parishioners who see faithful stewardship as a way of life — living in a spirit of gratitude and showing that gratitude in generosity.

In addition, our Oktoberfest in 2021 generated a profit of \$33,838 that was added to the general operating fund. Mother of Sorrows Outreach also raised \$151,280 for our food pantry and other local, national and global needs. We are truly blessed here at MOS!

One of the pressing issues that needs to be addressed as we move forward is the salary of our employees. Catholic Social Teaching reminds us of the need to pay our workers a salary that is just. In Luke 10:7 Jesus himself says "the worker deserves his wages."

In the past, many people who worked for the Church were volunteers who received no salary. Eventually, they were offered a small stipend that was in no way commensurate with their abilities or the work they did, and was usually far below the poverty level.

In order to hire competent employees, we need to budget for competitive salaries in order to attract the best candidates for the positions available.

THE SUNDAY COLLECTION

In last year's financial report that I sent to parishioners, I noted that "While some families have regularly increased their contributions, over the past five years we have not had an increase in the total Sunday offertory.... We should be trending upward of 3-5 % in the weekly collection each year to meet rising costs and to be able to expand and develop our ministries and programming."

I am happy to report that this year we saw a 12% increase in the Sunday collection! This was an awesome response to the "Sermon on the Amount," and helped us to meet rising costs and address needed capital repairs. Many thanks for your generous support in helping our parish move in the right direction.

OUR SAVINGS ACCOUNT

This fund is used for capital projects around the campus. Each month we add \$10,000 to this fund from the Sunday offertory in order to have the funds when we need them to maintain our facilities.

Last year we withdrew \$163,643 from this fund for the excavation and repaving of the lower parking lot, leaving a balance in our savings of \$11,643. Ideally, we need to be in a position where we can set aside \$20,000 per month into this fund.

Looking to the future, these are some of the items that we need to address:

- Refinishing the wooden pews in church. Weekly sanitizing during the pandemic removed the protective finish.
- Replacing the worn carpeting in the church narthex and meeting areas.
- Upgrading the lighting in the church to LED fixtures, in order to reduce electricity costs.
- Updating the sound system in the church to cover the "dead spaces" where it is difficult to hear.

Your ongoing support will enable us to stay on schedule with the regular maintenance and repair costs as set out in our 20-year master plan.

ENDOWMENT FUND

The Mother of Sorrows Endowment Fund was established to provide a legacy of faith for future generations. Grateful for the gift of faith that we have received from our parents and those who came before us, we have the obligation to pass on our faith in a vibrant and thriving parish to our children and those who will come after us.

During the last fiscal year, we added \$63,604 to this fund, bringing our current balance to \$246,881. In order to meet future needs of the parish, we need an endowment of several million dollars. We hope to grow this fund by encouraging parishioners and friends of MOS to leave a bequest to Mother of Sorrows Parish in their will or estate plan.

2002-2004 CONSTRUCTION LOAN

To fund the church and school renovation in 2004, the Diocese of Greensburg borrowed \$6.4 million in the form of a bond issue on behalf of Mother of Sorrows Parish and School. In December of 2021, working with the Diocese, we converted the balance of the bond into a simple loan with the Catholic Institute of the Diocese. The conversion lowered our monthly payments to \$27,223. Our outstanding balance is now \$3,085,704 and is scheduled to be paid off in January, 2033. Your generosity each week enables us to stay current on our debt payments. This is a great blessing. However, the reality is that one Sunday collection each month must be used to

service this debt obligation. The 2004 renovation of the church and school has allowed us to grow as a parish and accommodate many different groups and activities. For this we are most grateful. But we must not allow the debt of the past to hinder the growth of new initiatives as our parish continues to grow.

THE BOTTOM LINE

The bottom line is that Mother of Sorrows Parish continues to need your help. I am asking you to prayerfully consider your weekly commitment to MOS:

- Has it grown over the past several years, or is it still the same amount?
- As you reflect upon God's blessings in your life, are you able to show your gratitude by increasing your weekly contribution?
- Considering that we need a 3-5% increase in revenue each year, are you in a financial position to help us meet this goal?
- Do you use the We Share option for electronic giving to ensure that your support reaches the parish, even when you are away or not able to attend?

As stewards of Mother of Sorrows Parish, we need to rebuild our savings in order to maintain the plant and property of our church and school campus. Your increased offertory, combined with careful planning and financial management, will help us meet our day-to-day expenses, plan for capital improvements, and ensure that our community of faith continues to grow and thrive well into the future.


• Finally, in order to leave a legacy for the future, I ask you to consider including Mother of Sorrows Parish in your will or estate plan.


